## OUTCOME BASED EDUCATION

Outcome based education (OBE) is a student-centered instruction model that focuses on measuring student performance through outcomes. OBE is established to address the evolving needs of the global workforce in terms of skill learning and self-up grading with the most recent knowledge in practical fields. Instead of being content or trainer-centric, training techniques are created with the learner in mind. The goal is to increase learner participation.

The framework is designed to help institutions incorporate modern learning concepts in their daily operations. In addition to understanding what's expected, outcome-based education also encourages transparency. The basic principle of outcome-based education is that students must meet a specific standard to graduate. As per the curriculum prescribed by Bharathiar University, St. Joseph's College for Women is attempting to implement OBE through teaching strategies, and evaluation design so that students get graduated with confidence in their ability to acquire useful, desirable, and practical life skills.

## CHOICE - BASED CREDIT SYSTEM

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) is a flexible system of learning. 'Credit' defines the quantum of contents / syllabus prescribed for a course and determine the number of hours of instruction required. The distinguishing features of CBCS are the following.

It permits the students to :

- ☐ Choose Elective papers offered by their programmes.
- ☐ Undergo four skill based courses offered by the programme.

## EXAMINATION PROCEDURE

### (i) Process of Examination and Assessment under CBCS Blended with OBE:

1. The course of study in UG and PG programmes shall be based on the pattern of CBCS with continuous internal assessment (CIA) and Comprehensive External Examination (CEE) for each of the Core / Elective / Allied / Language / Practical papers.
2. The odd semester classes shall commence in June / July and those of even semester in December. CEE shall be held as the end semester University Examinations. The examination of the odd semester shall be scheduled in November / December and that of the even semester in April / May.
3. Each candidate in a UG programme shall earn a minimum of 140 credits, which include credits for language papers / core / elective / ancillary / practical papers and extension activities. Each candidate in a PG programme shall earn a minimum of 90 credits, which include credits for core / elective / supportive / practical papers.
4. There shall be a provision for earning additional credits by the candidates who opt for non-scholastic courses, viz., online SWAYAM / MOOC, value added and certificate courses each having at least 2 credits.
5. The non-scholastic courses shall not be considered for computing CGPA (Cumulative Grade Point Average).

### (ii) Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA)

The Components of CIA are Periodical Tests, Assignments / Seminars / Quiz / Group Discussion and Attendance. Students are expected to take both the tests that are administered to them. Paper presentation is must at the Post - Graduate level.

### (iii) Comprehensive External Examination (CEE)

- Two Comprehensive External Examinations are conducted in a year in November - December and in April - May. Comprehensive External Examinations will be conducted for all the courses in Part I, II, III and IV.
- For UG Programmes, a minimum of 40 % in CEE and 40 % in aggregate (CIA+CEE ) is required to pass.
- For PG Programmes, a minimum of 50 % in CEE and 50 % in aggregate (CIA+CEE) is required to pass.

Note: It is mandatory to bring ID cards and Hall tickets for all examinations.



## GENERAL GUIDELINES

### Semester System

As per the UGC norms, duration for UG courses is 3 years and PG courses is 2 years. All UG and PG programmes are offered under the semester system. Each academic year is divided into two semesters. Odd semester lapses during June to November and the even semester lapses during December to April of each academic year.

### Fees

Fees are payable within 15 days of the commencement of each semester. If a student fails to pay her fees on the day fixed for payment, a fine at the rate of Re.1 for each working day will be levied. If a student leaves the college during the semester, she will have no right to claim remission of any portion of the semester fees.

### Day Order System

Each semester will consist of 90 working days of five clock hours from 9.30 am to 3.30 pm. The college follows the day order system. The time table is denoted by I, II, III, IV, V, and VI day orders.

### General Assembly

General assembly will be held once in a month, on Monday of first week at 9.30 a.m. All the students and faculty members are expected to attend.

### Class Hours

The working day is divided into two sessions and each session into periods of one hour each. The morning session is from 09.30 a.m. to 12.15 p.m. and afternoon session is from 1.00 p.m. to 3.30 p.m. At the first warning bell at 9.25 a.m., the students are expected to be inside their respective class rooms for the morning prayer. During the prayer and regular classes silence has to be maintained.

Students are expected to greet the faculty members on the entry of their classes. No student shall leave the classroom without the permission of the faculty member before the class is dismissed.

### **Attendance**

Attendance will be taken on hourly basis. Late comers will not be admitted to the classroom. Attendance during tests and internal assessments is compulsory. Students should be regular and punctual in attending classes and in all activities connected to the college.

### **Attendance for the End Semester Examinations**

Students with 75 % of attendance are eligible for the End Semester Examination. Exemption may be granted for severe medical issues or for being a representative of the College participating in sports, games, camps, and other training programmes. The students who have not secured 75% of attendance but with a minimum of 60% will be allowed to apply for condonation based on genuine reasons. Students having less than 60% of the attendance are not eligible and should redo the missed semester.

### **Leave of Absence**

A student requiring leave must apply for it in advance in the prescribed form. In case of absence without prior notice, an application for leave must be submitted as soon as possible and not later than the first day of return to the college. Leave applied for reasonable causes will be granted.

Medical Certificate must be submitted for extended leave (more than three days) on medical grounds. In case of prolonged leave, parent or guardian should contact the college Principal not later than fourth day of the leave taken by the candidate.

A student being absent for the class, even for one hour without due permission, will not be given attendance for the whole day. The format for Application of leave is given in Annexure -I.

## CODE OF CONDUCT

10. Anyone who violates any of the rules of the college either in word or deed shall be deemed to have committed a breach of discipline and the Principal shall have full power to inflict any of the following punishments like; fine, loss of attendance, refusal to issue term certificate and conduct certificate, suspension and expulsion. Students should consult the college notice board morning and evening every day.

### **Certificates**

Any student past or present, desirous of getting transfer or conduct certificate must apply to the Principal in the form prescribed in Annexure - III. Original certificates will be given only in person.

### **Clearance Certificate**

It is only after obtaining a clearance from the library and class in-charge, the hall ticket and Transfer certificate will be issued.

### **Petition and Complaints**

Requests, petition, appeal and complaints of any kind must be made to the Principal. Students are not allowed to make a complaint in a body or to address any authority in a collective petition. Such combined action is subversive of good order.

### **Appeal to Parents / Guardians**

Parents / Guardians are requested to extend full co-operation to the authorities with regard to the character, discipline, attendance and academic progress of their daughter / wards. Parents - Teachers Meetings are conducted periodically in order to receive feedback and valuable suggestions from the parents.
